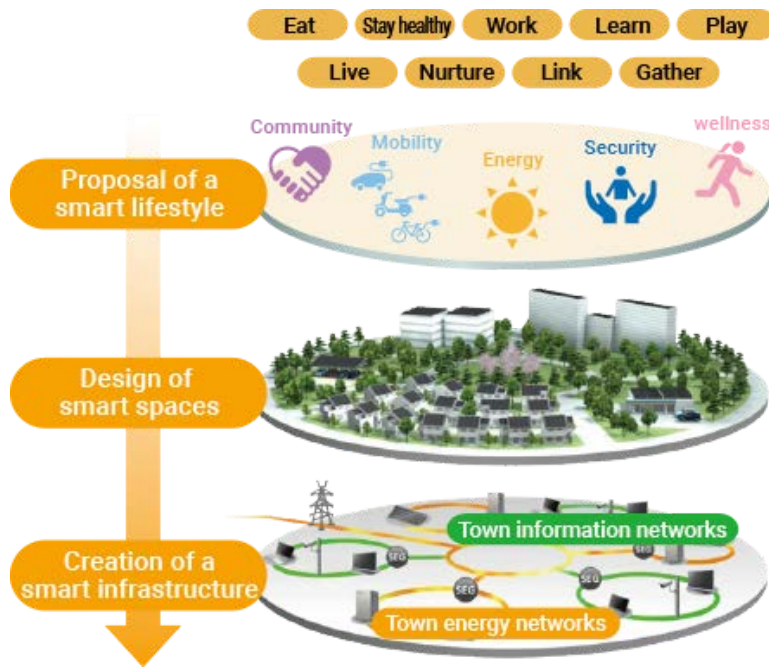

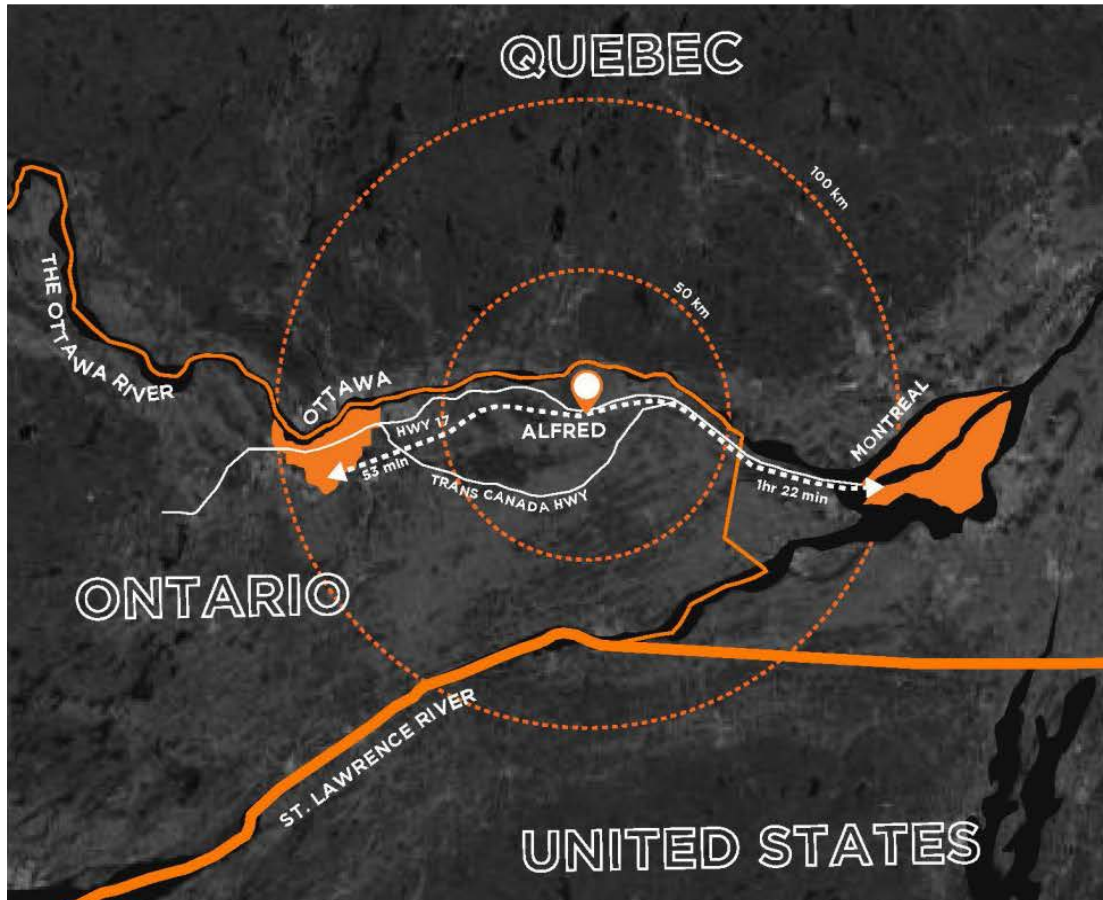

Living labs, which are popular where innovations performance is high, are "physical regions or virtual realities, or interaction spaces, in which stakeholders form public-private-people partnerships (4Ps) of companies, public agencies, universities, users, and other stakeholders, all collaborating for creation, prototyping, validating, and testing of new technologies, services, products, and systems in real-life contexts." (Westerlund & Leminen, 2011). As such, living labs are for community use and for innovations.
